The season has started and all Hinton FC teams are performing well with varied amounts of on the field success at the moment, but delivering some greatly entertaining games.

Activities off the field of play have also done extremely well, with several key developments to promote the club within the local and national community, and the securing of some very valuable funding through Sport England. The request to host a HUST v the Mayor of Hereford select XI was very well attended event, with approximately 300 people attending a the game involving ex Hereford United players as well as surprise guest appearances by two former Hereford United managers John Layton and Graham Turner.





The summer months has seen plenty of activity on the surrounding areas of club grounds, with sessions of grass cutting, strimming, fence repairs, and of course the dreaded car park pots filled. Many thanks to all that have provided tireless support in addressing these items, and hopefully this will encourage others to come forward and support the maintenance of





the club grounds as we are a volunteer club, and require the generous donation of peoples time, focus and willingness.

Funding has been secured through Sport England to purchase a tractor and equipment to maintain the main pitch and surrounding areas, this will provide a significant saving to the club and will help us provide a main pitch that is capable of having more games played on it throughout a season and permit a higher standard of football to be played at all levels. There is also initial progress being made on a potential new clubhouse with new facilities, such as a clubroom and improved changing rooms, so look out for calls of support to get this going!

You may have also seen that Hinton FC have been able to be part of the green token collection the Hereford Asda store, while up against two very strong and worthy charities the publicity has been very worthwhile, as has the first team match report in the Hereford Times in Oct which has lead to several enquires into the club, and potential sponsor opportunities may arise very soon, as we follow up options by interested people.

We are continuing to look to expand our teams especially in the younger age groups we have in the club, so if you fancy being involved or know of someone who would like to be running a team at Hinton FC send them our way. Many hands make light work!!
